<p><b>On Willis G. Calderwood:</b>            Willis G. Calderwood was a prominent Minnesota Prohibitionist during the Progressive era of the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. He was a candidate for the U. S. Senate in 1916 and again in 1918, running a surprisingly strong campaign in 1918 against the long-time incumbent, Senator Knute Nelson. Calderwood in 1918 ran on the National Party ticket, "a temporary amalgam of pro-war Socialists, a Bull Moose Progressive remnant, and the left wing of a fragmented Prohibition party," in loose coalition with the suffragist movement, the Nonpartisan League and other Progressives. He had a home at 986 15<sup>th</sup> Ave. SE.  <i>Quote is from p. 176 of Carl H. Chrislock. <p><b>On Maria Sanford:</b>            University of Minnesota president William Watts Folwell hired Maria Sanford in 1880 to teach rhetoric, literature and speech to early generations of University men and women. She was the University's first female professor. In 1907 financial problems caused her to leave her home at 14<sup>th</sup> Ave. and 6<sup>th</sup> St. SE and buy a home at 1050 13<sup>th</sup> Ave. SE. Sanford was a member of the Como Congregational Church and often preached there. A renowned and impressive public speaker, Maria Sanford was much in demand for suffragist rallies and other public events in the last decade of her life (d. 1920). The University named its first student residence hall for women after Maria Sanford, shortly following her death.</p>					1	2
