SECIA Statement of Response to the Killing of Amir Locke March 1st, 2022

On Wednesday, February 2nd, Amir Locke, 22 years old, was fatally shot by the Minneapolis Police Department (MPD) during a no-knock warrant search which Amir Locke's name was not included on. SECIA mourns the death of Amir Locke and stands in solidarity with his family calling for justice, accountability and transparency on this investigation. As we, board and staff, stated in our SECIA Statement in Response to the Killing of George Floyd last June and SECIA Statement of Response to the Killing of Daunte Wright and the Chauvin Murder Trial on April, this death marks yet another in the horrific history of police brutality toward Black folks, indiginous people, and other people of color in our country. We are committed to standing in solidarity and in support of the community, and everyone impacted by this new and continuing trauma.

SECIA condemns these acts of violence and calls for accountability for the officers involved. As a neighborhood association, we urge everyone to unite toward eliminating systemic police brutality and healing our communities. We must all stand up for one another's rights to justice. With this mission in mind, we seek your help to work towards creating alternative resources for community safety. Join us in working to develop a holistic approach to community safety and equitable engagement with the Como Cares Team, Reimagining SECIA, and our evolving draft racial equity framework and resolution.
